


Fabulous keepsake cards that are simple to make but look so stunning when made up and will WOW the recipient.



For best results print sheets 1 to 3 onto photo paper or good quality cardstock and sheets 5 & 6 onto good quality paper. For a pretty lining print sheet 4 onto the reverse of sheets 5 & 6





Before cutting out score each of the fold lines as per these diagrams. Note the red partial score lines and cut on the blue lines. Fold and crease all the score lines using a bone folder



Take the pieces from sheet 1 & 2. Add double sided tape to one of the pieces where marked in red on the photo making sure you avoid the hole and elastic slot



Fold in all 4 tabs, Line up and adhere the 2 pieces together.



Your card will now look like this from above, with the 2 tabs on the inside of your card




Take the roof support, fold and crease as shown in the photo with 1 triangular piece coming forward and the other backwards. Add adhesive to the front of triangle marked by the black arrow and to the back of the triangle marked by the red arrow on the photo



Add the roof support to the card as shown in the photo.
The red and black arrows show where the same triangles from the above photos are adhered.
Add adhesive to the flap as marked in red on the photo.
The elastic hooks are to right front and left back



Take the roof, fold and crease along the score line, open up and place face down



Collapse your pop up and adhere the flap we added adhesive to in the above step just slightly below the middle score line on the roof. I have marked the flap we added adhesive to in red on the photo, but this will now be underneath



Fold the other half of the roof to the front



Your card will now look like this when squared up

It's easiest to add the decoupage now whilst you can still flatten the card without the rubber band trying to pop it up for you! lol

Don't add too much depth to the decoupage as you still want your card to fit into it's matching envelope

I added decoupage to all 4 sides. But as the decoupage is all separate in the kit you can add it where you like, or leave it off if you wish!



Add an elastic band to the hooks inside. Make sure that the band is just long enough to be unstretched when the card is popped up. If your band is too long then add a twist (as below) to shorten it






Flatten your card. You may find it easier to use paper clips to stop it from popping up whilst you secure the base. Flip up 2 of the base pieces




Fold all the flaps to the front and add adhesive where shown in red on the photo

Fold the top flaps down and adhere in place



The base of your card will now look like this



To close your card squish it with the elastic band running left to right. Gently start to fold in the 2 base pieces. Your card will try to resist ... that's the pop up mechanism working lol



Gently make sure that the base pieces are folded into the base of the card ...

... until it is fully folded and flat and will slip into it's matching envelope. I printed the coordinating backing paper onto the reverse of my envelope to give a pretty lining










A personal greeting can be written onto the underside of the roof



























