

Fun keepsake cards that are simple to make but look so stunning when made up and will WOW the recipient



6 & 7 - onto paper. Print sheet 5 onto the reverse of sheet 4 . Print sheet 6 onto the reverse of sheets 7 & 8 for a pretty lining to your envelope







Please read the instructions all the way through before starting to make up.

Before cutting out use a ruler and scoring tool to score the fold lines on sheets where marked I have marked these in red on the diagram I didn't print the backing onto the reverse of sheet 4 to make it clearer for you to see what I am doing.

It doesn't matter which way up it is to begin with so long as the half circles are to the left and right but keep the base the same way up for all the following steps. I have marked this and each following photo with top to show this

take the base ...

... and turn it over

Measure 3 cm from the top and draw
a line and make a mark at the central
point


To help you follow what I'm doing I have marked the central point on the base with a blue A on this and all the following photos

Turn the base over keeping it the same way up. Punch the holes where shown on the base and wheel on sheet 3.

Attach the two pieces together using a small brad. Open out the prongs but leave some wiggle room to allow your wheel to turn freely.







Turn the wheel so the number 24 is at the top Add foam pads in the 4 corners of the base (I have marked these in blue on the photo), making sure the wheel is free to turn.

Once again keeping the base and wheel the same way up as per top marked on the photo

Take the bottom of the card and cut out and remove the small square of card to create a window. adhere over the wheel attaching it to the foam pads you added above, centering the design onto the front and ensure the number 24 is centered in the window. The bottom of the card is a little larger than the base to aid with centering Place to one side

Take the card base from sheet 4

Turn the card base over keeping it the same way up

Mark the central point of the score line

To help you follow what I'm doing I have marked the central point on the base with a blue B on this and all the following photos



fold over along top score line of the card base and add dst where shown in blue on the photo



Adhere the top half of the character to the dst we added above, aligning and centering along the bottom edge. If necessary trim away any card base that shows at the front above the shoulders.





Fold up along the bottom score line, and add dst to the same flap where shown in blue on the photo




Take the wheel/base/bottom we assembled earlier (left photo) and keeping the same way up turn over (right photo)










These next few steps will enable the exact placement of the wheel/base/bottom. This is very easy to do but I have included lots of info and photos so you can see exactly how to do this.

Take the card base/character top

keeping it the same way up and the flap with the dst valley folded turn the card base/character top over. The flap and dst will be folded away from you and the score line will now be at the bottom

Note the central mark you made earlier and the B I added on page 2 of the tutorial are now visible.

Match up the central marks A & B along the line we drew on the back of the wheel/base/bottom and adhere in place





Your card will now look like this when you turn it over and the wheel/base/bottom will be aligned exactly.



To flatten your card lift up the character top (left photo)

take hold of the wheel/base/bottom (right photo)



and fold the wheel base bottom up and under the character top (left photo) till it looks like the right photo



You can now add the decoupage using foam pads or silicone glue. Add as much as you want, I have included more than you need in most of the kits. I also like to add a bit of sparkle and glitter too! lol



Make up the matching envelope using the directions on the sheets.



Your finished card.

Just turn the wheel once a day to reveal the next number ... how cute is that!!

To stand your card up place on a shelf or edge of mantelpiece etc.
Allow the wheel/base/bottom to 'dangle' over the front and the base to 'sit' on the shelf, placing the bottom edge of the top of the character behind the wheel/base/bottom as per the bottom photo.



















