


T-Slider Card Assembly Instructions



The zip file contains the photo of the completed project along with cutting files. The design was created with Adobe Illustrator and saved as an SVG file. The file has been opened in Silhouette studio and saved for your convenience. The sample card was created using Silhouette studio.

The following is the tutorial for the Anniversary T-Slider Card. Most other T-Slider cards are assembled in a similar fashion.



There are basically 4 pieces to the T-slider card. This version creates a 5 5/8" by 5 1/4". It fits in a 6" x 6" envelope. Optionally you can reduce the size of the card to fit a 5.5" square envelope.


The first sheet has the traditional T-Slider pieces. An additional piece on sheet two in the lower right corner adds an additional layer to facilitate better sliding. The second sheet also contains the design elements for the Anniversary card. The anniversary card has a card top instead of the slider top demonstrated in Kim Score's tutorial.

To assemble you will need to select 4-5 compatible colors. The word art was cut from printable foil. The added sandwich layer was cut from heavy card stock. All other pieces were cut from 176 G/M². The dashed lines are not cutting lines. They are folding lines.



Start with the inside accordion piece. The fold lines create a mountain fold with a tab. The tab is the area to attach the T-shaped piece. The slit in the mountain is where the smaller tab is threaded and attached to the opposite side.

Looking from the back side you can see where the tabs are glued to the base. From the front the two tabs look like they are from the same piece. When the tab on the left is pulled the right tab becomes visible. It is important to make sure the sentiment is placed appropriately so they are hidden and become visible when pulling the T-shape.





Using double sided adhesive add the fancy sandwich shape to the base. This piece's inside dimensions are slightly larger than the T-shape. Add adhesive strips to the T-slider base. Make sure to leave the slider opening free of adhesive.

I like to pull the tape off one piece at a time since the adhesive is permanent. The pieces align nicely since the sandwich piece has small corners to align the piece.



The last piece to assemble is the card topper which is the same size as the slider opening. It will hide the inside sentiment.

At this point the card assembly is finished. Add any other embellishments such as a frame.
