



A Make Me project from MJM Design Studios #workshopinazipfile

These instructions are my serving suggestions, of course you can assemble your project in anyway you like, this is just to share with you how I created my project and give you some ideas along the way. Now you have all the elements you can do with them as you wish, even create an entirely new project!

1. Print off the element sheets for your project, I have added a guide to paper and card stock weight to each sheet for you.



2. I used a 7" x 7" card base for this project. If you don't have one you can make one. Cut 1 piece of card stock 7½" x 7" (19cm x 17.8cm) then score and fold the extra 1/2" (1.2cm) to make a joining tab
Cut 1 piece of card stock 7" x 7" (17.8cm x 17.8cm)
Add double sided tape along the tab and adhere this to the back of the square piece



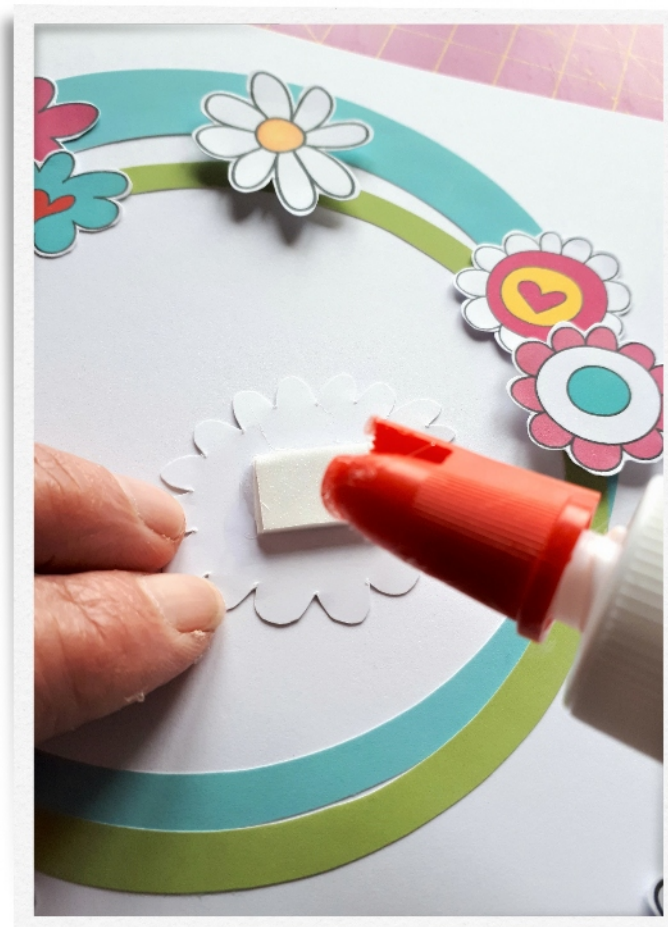
3. Cut out one of the inserts and adhere it to the inside of your card



4. Cut out the two circles, including the middles and arrange on the card front, adhere them in place.



5. Cut out the embellishments and arrange them around the circles.
NOTE Don't stick any of the embellishments down at this point!
Follow the lines of the circles, balancing elements and leaving gaps for breathing space, make sure both circles get connected with the flowers to pull the design together.



6. Once you are happy with the design you can start to adhere the embellishments in place.
TIP Take a photo of the design if possible before taking it apart to use as a reminder.
Stick some of the elements flat and add dimension with foam pads to others to build layers and interest
TIP adding wet glue to a foam pad once the backing is off gives you some wiggle room when sticking down



7. Shape some of the flowers too, just because they are a flat print out it doesn't mean they have to stay that way.



8. Cut out some of the letters for your sentiment and adhere them in the centre of the circles



9. I added a small embellishment which was cut from the middle of a spare flower to tie the lettering into the design, also putting the letters under the edges of the flowers creates a cohesive design.



10. I added finishing touches by doodling around the edges of the circles to tie the design together, picking out details with a glitter pen and adding flat back gems to the centre of some of the flowers



11. Cut out the two pieces for the envelope from the element sheets, scoring and folding as marked. Put double sided tape along the 3 tabs of the envelope back ...



12. Fold the tabs up and adhere the front to them to complete your envelope.
