

Swing Pop Out Cards by SuzieQ Kuttables
This tutorial is using my design Let It Be
The finished card







Print out the paper. This is not optional as this card requires two sided paper. Then print out Page 1 on the opposite side, which is the base card shown on the lower left. I print the base card from cardstock. On Page 1 is also the two tabs needed for this card.



On Page 2 is the inside mechanism.



Page 3 has the inside panels and decoupage.





Starting with the inside mechanism make a valley fold on the right side and a mountain fold on the left side as shown.

Attach the inside panels. You can switch this up by having the sentiment on the right side and both panels on the left side. Please note: After I made this tutorial I decided to make the inside panels smaller instead of the exact size needed to fill the space so the actual file will be the artwork, but a little smaller.

Take this panel and attach it to the right side of the card. See the photos below.




Glue just the far right side panel to the base of the card. The left and center portions will not be glued.

Fold the two tabs in half and attach as you see in the photo to the left.

Open the inside mechanism up and put glue or double stick tape on the two tabs as shown.

I forgot to take this photo while I was making this so I took apart the card to show that you fold the inside mechanism as you can see on the left side photo. Please note: the paper clip is there only to keep the mechanism closed for the photo.

Then simply close the card so the exposed double stick tape on the tabs sticks to the back of the front of the card.



Working with the card closed put double stick tape on just the opening. If you use glue be careful that the glue doesn't get on the inside of the card. Attach the matching shape to this so the hole is completely filled. See below.

Decorate with the word artwork and the gnome as desired.
