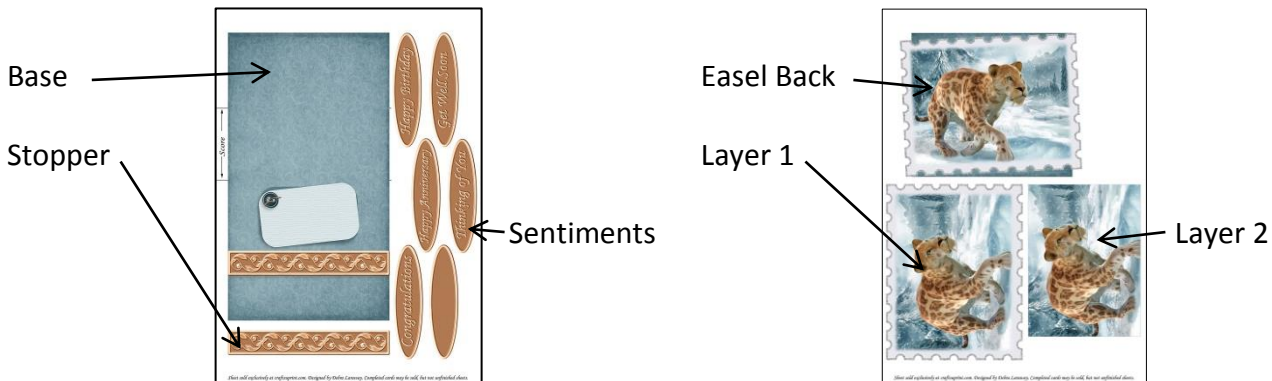


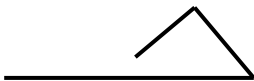
Stamp Easel Card Assembly Directions

In addition to the sheets in the kit you will need glue or double stick tape, sticky pads or silicone glue for layering, and any other embellishments you would like such as glitter and ribbon. Your kit includes two sheets. One sheet is the easel base, with a stopper for layering, and sentiment tags. The other sheet has the easel back with the main image, and pyramid layers.

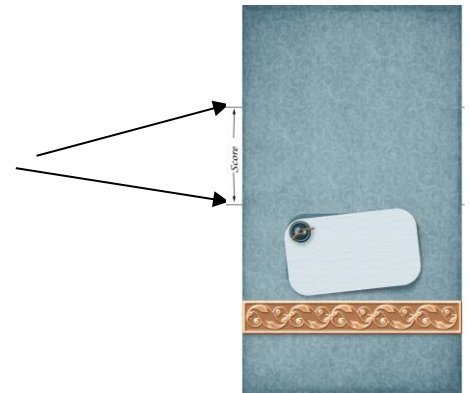


Making the Card

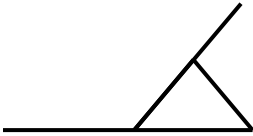
1. Print 1 copy of each page on good quality paper.
2. Cut out all pieces, but leave the left side of the base intact. To give a more professional appearance to the card, the score lines are not printed across the base of the card. Score where shown, then trim the left side of the base. Using a ruler or score board will help give a nice straight line.
3. Valley fold on score lines. From the side, your base should look like this.



4. Create the pyramid using sticky pads or silicone glue to layer. If you prefer a flatter card for mailing, use double stick tape or a glue stick to layer. You could also skip layer 1 (the whole stamp by itself) and save it as a topper for another card and still get a nice effect.



5. Create a stopper by layering the separate stopper on top of the topper printed on the base. You will need to use sticky pads or silicone glue as the stopper does need to have some height to it for the card to stand properly
6. Attach the bottom half of the pyramid to the back of the top section of the easel base using double sided tape or glue. Check that your easel card stands properly. From the side, your card will look like this.



7. If desired, embellish using glitter, beads, etc. The base has a blank writing space for your signature or a personal message.
